

Bible Reading & Annotation:

Annotation is a method of noting certain words or sentences in a text that you read by highlighting those words, phrases, or sentences; or by writing your own thoughts and questions in the margin of the text. For the next couple weeks, you are going to be given Scripture verses to read and asked to highlight the miracles you find as you read the text. In addition to highlighting the miracles, you are also welcome to highlight any other words/phrases/sentences that you find particularly interesting, and/or to write in the margins of your Bible any thoughts or questions you may have as you read.

- Read Exodus 14 and highlight the miracles you see in this passage

Week 1: Day 2

Prayer:

Listen to Rhéma Academy audio - Blessing Your Spirit with the Blessings of Your Father: Day 2

Scripture Memory:

- Copy each line of Psalm 100:4-5 onto several different notecards (one card for each line of the passage, so six notecards total: 1. Write: "Psalm 100:4-5" and "Enter his gates with thanksgiving;" 2. "Go into his courts with praise." 3. "Give thanks to him and praise his name." 4. "For the Lord is good." 5. "His unfailing love continues forever," 6. "And his faithfulness continues to each generation").

You will use these notecards to help you memorize Psalm 100:4-5 for the next several weeks.

- After you have written out the verses on the notecards, read the lines on each of the cards. Then, read through all the cards two more times (for a total of reading through Psalm 100:4-5 three times). Then, file the notecards in your index card box.

Read Numbers 22:9-41

As you read, remember to highlight the miracles you see in this passage. Also, remember to write any thoughts or questions you have in the margins of your Bible.

Bible Reading & Socratic Discussion:

A Socratic Discussion is a conversation with open-ended questions. Open-ended questions are not yes or no type questions but are meant to draw a person to think deeply about a text and share their thoughts. These are the types of discussions we will have during our “Socratic Discussion” meetings.

Christianity

Christianity is the word used for those who believe that Jesus is the Son of God, the One Person after Adam and Eve who was born without sin, and who Himself being God, came into the world as a human to redeem all of mankind from slavery to sin, and to bring all who will believe in Him and follow Him into right relationship with God the Father. After Jesus died on the cross, and came back to life again and then returned to Heaven again, He sent the Holy Spirit to us. The Holy Spirit lives inside every person who believes in and follows Jesus, and Holy Spirit helps us to make wise decisions because He shows us what we should do as we ask God and listen to His instruction.

Christians also read the Bible, which is called the Word of God. The Bible was written by many different people who heard God's voice and wrote down what He asked them to.

Christianity is called a "religion" by many people, but it is actually a RELATIONSHIP, a friendship with the Jesus, God the Father and Holy Spirit.

There are more than 2,000,000,000 people in the world today who call themselves Christians, who live in countries all around the world.

Animism

Animism is a word we use to describe the various religions who believe that they must make evil spirits happy so bad things will not happen to them.

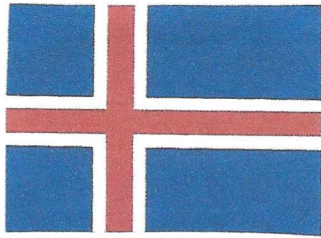
Many people who believe in Animism believe there is a great creator god or a sky god. But they do not believe that he is a god they can know. They believe the creator god is very far away and that he forgot about them and isn't interested in what happens to them. Instead, people who believe in Animism believe that the evil spirits, what we would call the demonic realm, or satan, they believe that these evil spirits will do bad things to them if people do not do what the evil spirits say.

Many people who practice Animism are very open to hearing about Jesus, because He is more powerful than the evil spirits that bring so many problems to people! When they hear about Jesus calming the storms and telling satan to get away from people, they are so happy to know

a God who is more powerful than the evil spirits they have feared. Now, there is no more reason to fear! They know who the REAL God is when they hear of Jesus!
